Special Achievers This Week




Every week the staff look out for those children who are just that little bit extra special in the current week to award them one of our Achievers Certificates.

Rights Respecting School



REACCREDITATION OUTCOME

Outcomes for Strands A, B and C have all been achieved.

Lyme Community Primary School continues to meet the standard for UNICEF UK's Rights Respecting Schools Award at Gold: Rights Respecting.

This report is based on a virtual reaccreditation visit. The assessor would like to thank the children, the Senior Leadership Team, and staff for their warm welcome to the school, for the opportunity to speak with adults and children during the assessment and for the detailed evidence provided to support the process. Prior to the accreditation visit, the school completed a comprehensive School Evaluation: Gold form and provided a good range of digital evidence.

It was evident that children's rights are embedded across the school and underpin every facet of school life.

Strengths of the school include:

- A committed, strategic approach of Senior Leaders and the RRSAs lead to sustain an embedded rights-based approach, putting it at the core of the school's ethos, linked to values and policies.
- A common language of rights which is used across the school and supports children to explore and discuss a range of issues.
- The caring and nurturing ethos where staff have ensured that children feel valued and respected.
- The recent focus on developing the curriculum, particularly literacy, to reflect the diverse community and to build children's cultural capital.
- Pupil voice is valued highly by staff. The range of pupil voice groups and other mechanisms provide ample opportunities for all children to put their suggestions forward and for these to be acted upon.

Just before the Summer holidays, Miss. Evans and the Rights-Respecting Ambassadors were assessed for re-accreditation of the Gold UNICEF Rights-Respecting Schools Award. I am very pleased to say that they were successful! This award means a lot to us at Lyme as we strive each day to teach our children about their rights and how they contribute to our school community. Please take a few minutes to read the strengths outlined in the report - it makes us so proud that external visitors recognise what we already know about our school.

Well done to the whole team at Lyme but especially Miss. Evans, who worked so hard in preparing everything for the day.

Should lifejackets be compulsory for all on open water?



In the news this week

In Canada, the government in the province of Ontario is set to pass a new law that will make it compulsory for children aged 12 and under to wear lifejackets on boats. Parents, guardians, or other adults supervising children could be subject to a fine of up to \$200 (£130) if they do not comply. In the UK, currently, there is no legal requirement for anyone using rivers and seas for leisure purposes to wear a lifejacket/personal flotation device (PFD).

Things to talk about at home ...

- Share your experience of lifejackets. Have you ever been required to wear one? Where were you? Did everyone wear them?
- Can you make a list of all the times you think lifejackets should be worn?
- Do you feel there should be laws in place to ensure people wear lifejackets on boats at sea? If so, do you believe they should apply to everyone?
